1S	28.4.95	2185	Bertholdstein	The Annunciation in the Benedictine Abbey of St. Gabriel at Bertholdstein in Styria. The building was originally a castle built in the 13 <sup>th</sup> century and rebuilt in the 19 <sup>th</sup> century. It became an abbey in 1918. In 1942 the abbey was expropriated but returned in 1945 after the war
5S50	16.4.93	2126	Admont	Monastery of Admont in Styria in central Ennstal. A wooden statue of "Death" by Josef Stammel in the library of this monastery.
6S	17.9.93	2138	Mariastern/Gwiggen	Monastery of Mariastern in the Vorarlberg. A stained glass window of St. Benedict.
7S	18.11.94	2174	Franziskanerkloster	Designed and engraved by Werner Pfeiler; shows detail of a sculpture of a lion at the foot of the pulpit being stabbed by a warrior below. Printed in both recess [black] and photogravure [grey and yellow]; comb perforated 13¾x14. The pulpit is in the 12 <sup>th</sup> century Franciscan monastery in Salzburg.
7S50	29.4.94	2155	Altenburg	A cupola fresco by Paul Troger, in the Monastery of Altenburg in Lower Austria, upon the 850 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the foundation of this Benedictine Abbey on 21 <sup>st</sup> July 1144. The stamp was designed and engraved by Werner Pfeiler and printed in both recess [black] and photogravure [orange-brown and cornflower blue]. Comb perforation 13¾x14
8S	15.9.95	2200	Stift Wilhering	Early Gothic doorway of the Monastery of Wilhering in Upper Austria. Originally founded about 1146 as a Cistercian Abbey and rebuilt in 1733 after a major fire.
10S	26.8.94	2165	Maria Luggau	Commemorates the 400 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the foundation of the Parish of Maria Luggau in Carinthia. The stamp was designed and engraved by Werner Pfeiler and shows St. Peregrinus the Servite saint during the miraculous healing of his leg. Printed in both recess [black] and photogravure [dark orange and Turkish blue]. Comb perf 13¾x14.
20S	8.10.93	2141	Georgenberg/Fiecht	Monastery of St. Georgenberg - Fiecht in Tyrol. An Abbatial Crosier
26S	6.10.95	2203	Franzisk. Schwaz	The "Mother of Sorrows" from the Franciscan Cloister at Schwaz in Tirol. The church and monastery were built by C. Reichartinger in 1508-15 and refurbished in the Baroque style by J Singer in 1735.
30S	7.10.94	2171	Schottenstift, Wien	Designed and engraved by Werner Pfeiler and shows the Madonna and Child at the Scottish Monastery in Vienna. Printed in both recess [black] and photogravure [red and yellow]; comb perforated 13¾x14

Three additions are announced, and as previous values of this series they are designed and engraved by W. Pfeiler.
